

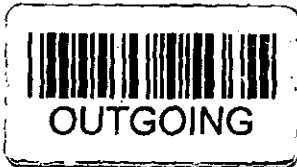

CONDITIONS

1. This licence relates to the area as shown edged red on the attached Plan Ref No. P1062/01.
2. The licence holder shall operate the site in accordance with the Plans Ref No. P1062/01 and P1062/02 and details 1062-1, 1062-2 and 1062-3 attached to this licence. The licence holder shall notify the Waste Disposal Authority hereinafter called the Authority, in writing of any proposed change in the actual conduct of operations from the proposals shown in the plans and details attached to this licence, as altered by any previously notified changes, at least one month before the proposed change is implemented. No change in the conduct of operations shall be instigated until the change has been approved in writing by the Authority and the amendment has been attached to the licence.
3. Waste transfer operations shall be limited to within the area edged blue on the attached Plan Ref No. P1062/01.

PERMITTED WASTE TYPES & QUANTITIES

4. Subject to condition 5 below the types and quantities of waste accepted at the site shall be as described in the attached schedule S1062/01.
5. No waste which is poisonous, noxious or polluting or likely to give rise to an environmental hazard shall be accepted at the site other than as described on the schedule attached to the licence. Any such waste shall be dealt with as described in the details attached to this licence.
6. The quantity of waste stored on site at any time shall not exceed 300 cubic metres, 320 tonnes.

SITE DEVELOPMENT & ENGINEERING

7. A road from the site entrance to the waste transfer area shall be provided and maintained. The road shall have a hard surface and be adequately drained to prevent accumulations of mud, stone or other material adhering to the wheels of vehicles leaving the site.
8. Within two months of the date of commencement of operations under this licence, a site identification board of durable material and finish shall be displayed and maintained at the site entrance, showing the name of the operator, the hours of operation, the licence number and the name of the Authority responsible for issuing the site licence.
9. No waste transfer operations shall be carried out unless the site has been secured to prevent unauthorised vehicular access.

10. The existing gates at the site entrance shall be kept locked at all times while the site is unattended and all precautions shall be taken to prevent unauthorised access to the site.

11. All walls, fences and gates shall be maintained to ensure the security of the site at all times.

12. All concreted areas shall be repaired or reinstated as necessary to ensure they have an impermeable surface.

13. All tarmac and hardstanding areas shall be maintained.

14. Waste shall not remain on site for longer than one month, except for general household waste in which case it shall be removed within four days of the date of its delivery to the site.

15. The drainage of the site shall be as described in the details attached to this licence. Any proposals for amendment to the drainage or surfacing of the site shall be submitted for the prior approval of the Authority.

SITE OPERATIONS

16. Subject to condition 17 below (unless agreed otherwise in writing by the Authority), operating hours for waste transfer operations shall be from 07.30 hours to 17.30 hours Monday to Friday inclusive and 07.30 hours to 12.00 hours on Saturday and closed on Sundays and public holidays.

17. No waste transfer operations shall be carried out during the hours covered by official lighting up times (i.e. half-an-hour after sunset to half-an-hour before sunrise) unless lighting is provided.

18. All waste delivered to the site except for uncontaminated earth and excavation waste, stone, brick rubble and hardcore, tipped on the ground shall be loaded into a container as soon as possible after the deposit and not later than by the end of the working day on which the waste is received.

19. Uncontaminated earth and excavation waste, stone, brick rubble and hardcore shall be stored in the designated area as shown on Plan Ref No. P1062/02.

20. Whenever waste handling operations are being carried out the site shall be adequately manned to ensure that waste is handled in compliance with the conditions of this licence.

21. Whenever waste handling operations are being carried out the site shall be supervised by a person competent and qualified to ensure that waste is handled in compliance with the conditions of this licence.

22. The terms of the site licence shall be made known to any person who is given responsibility for the management or control of the site and a copy of the licence shall be available on the site whenever the site is operational.

23. Each load received shall be inspected to ensure that it conforms to the requirements of the licence.

24. Any waste which has been accepted at the site and subsequently found to be contrary to condition 5 of this licence shall be placed in a secure storage area within the site and the Authority informed immediately. The Authority shall be given not less than 24 hours notice of the proposed method of dealing with the rejected waste. The waste shall be removed from the site within 7 days of the date of receipt unless agreed otherwise with the Authority.

25. No waste shall be deposited unless the site is equipped with a mechanical shovel or similar plant in full working condition.

26. Containers of waste types which could become windblown shall be netted or sheeted or otherwise enclosed other than when the container is being loaded. All such containers shall be netted, sheeted or closed by the end of the working day.

27. The deposit on the public highway of mud, stone or the materials caused by the operation of the site shall be prevented.

28. Any spillage of liquid shall be dealt with immediately to clear or alleviate the effect of the spillage and adequate quantities of dry sand or absorbent materials shall be on hand.

29. At all times the site shall be kept in a tidy condition. Any loose waste which may be lying on the site shall be gathered up and disposed of tidily each day.

30. No material shall be burned within the boundaries of the site and a fire at the site shall be regarded as an emergency and immediate action shall be taken to extinguish it.

31. Any items or materials of value recovered from the waste shall be stored as shown on Plan Ref No. P1062/02 and the details attached to this licence and shall at all times be maintained in a tidy condition.

32. Batteries shall be stored in such a manner as to prevent the spillage or leakage of acid.

33. The Authority shall be immediately informed of any incident that could give rise to danger to public health, pollution of water, or could be seriously detrimental to local amenity, including any fire.

34. Action shall be taken to deal effectively with any vermin or insect pests on the site.

35. All necessary action shall be taken to prevent the dissemination of odour, fumes, dust or windblown material.

RECORD KEEPING

36. A record shall be kept of the types, quantities and dates of waste deposited and the final disposal points used. These records shall be made available to the Authority on request.

37. By the 30th of April each year, whilst this licence is in force, a summary, in a form approved by the Authority, of the types and quantities of waste deposited at the site during the period from the 1st of April the previous year to the 31st of March, shall be submitted to the Authority.

Footnotes.

Fridges and freezers contain chlorofluorocarbons (CFC's) which are believed to damage the ozone layer and present a threat to human health. The CFC coolant can be recovered from such appliances and reused. This Authority would support the recycling of CFC's and you may wish to participate in such a recovery scheme. Further information on the recovery of CFC's can be obtained from the Authority.

Comment has been received on the following matters and you are advised to contact the organisation involved.

National Rivers Authority (Yorkshire Region), Rivers House, 21 Park Square South, Leeds LS1 2QG.

The drainage gully near the yard gateway should be restored to working condition. It must be established whether this drain discharges to public foul sewer or surface water system. If the latter, more stringent conditions may be required with respect to storage or treatment of liquids on site.

Yorkshire Water Services Ltd, Western House, Western Way, Halifax Road, Bradford, BD6 2LZ.

No objections provided all foul drainage is connected to the appropriate public sewer and surface water is disposed of separately.

Yorkshire Electricity plc, P.O. Box 89, Parry Lane, Bradford BD4 8TW.

Yorkshire Electricity plc apparatus exists in the vicinity of the site and access to repair, maintain and renew will be required at all times.

West Yorkshire Fire Service, Oakroyd Hall, Bradford Road, Birkenshaw BD11 2DY.

The water supplies in the surrounding area are adequate for such a waste disposal site, however the following points need to be borne in mind.

- a) That adequate means of escape be available for any persons working in confined areas and throughout the site.
- b) That adequate fire fighting equipment be available and maintained.
- c) Adequate space be kept throughout the site to prevent firespread.

d) Any waste materials stored or kept in such a way as to provide easy access by fire fighting appliances for fire fighting.

British Telecom, (Cable Network Division), Ref. PCE 451/3, Telephone House, 11 Broadway, Bradford, BD1 1BA.

British Telecom plant exists in the vicinity of the site.

Other Statutory Requirements.

Licence holders should note that this licence is issued under Section 5 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 and it does not provide them with exemption from any other statutory requirements.

The licence holder may apply to the Authority to have the conditions of this licence modified, pursuant to Section 7 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974.

It should be noted that even though the licence holder may comply with all the above conditions and any other requirements deemed appropriate, this does not necessarily exclude the licence holder from prosecution should subsequent pollution of the environment occur. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE LICENCE HOLDER TO PREVENT POLLUTION.

SPECIAL WASTE REGULATIONS 1996 - MODIFICATION

In February the Environment Agency wrote to you regarding the Special Waste Regulations 1996 and the fact that certain wastes are now classed as special waste for the first time.

The letter stated that if a written reply was not received from you by 10 March the Agency would modify your licence to exclude these "newly" special wastes from your waste management licence. Alternatively you may have indicated your wishes on this matter by returning a form to the Agency.

Please find enclosed a section 37 notice of modification. The notice has the effect of modifying your waste management licence as described from the date given on the notice.

The terms of the notice now form part of your licence. You should take steps to ensure that wastes which are classified as special waste (such as bonded asbestos waste), are no longer accepted at your site. Failure to do so is likely to constitute a breach of the waste management licence for the site.

Details of the appeal procedure is given on the reverse of the notice however if you have any queries on this matter please initially contact this office.

S37 NOTES

Appeals

If a licence holder is aggrieved by the decision of the Agency in modifying conditions specified in a Waste Management Licence he may appeal to the Secretary of State in accordance with Section 43 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990. Appeals must be notified within 6 months of the date of this notice to The Planning Inspectorate, Room 12/03D, Tolgate House, Houlton Street, Bristol, BS2 9DJ.

The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of notice of an appeal but he will not normally be prepared to exercise this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of an appeal.

Where a notice giving the Agency's decision to modify a Waste Management Licence includes a statement that for the purpose of preventing pollution of the environment or harm to human health Section 43(4) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 should not apply to the decision, the notification of an appeal against the decision will not of itself render the decision ineffective pending determination of the appeal.

If you consider that such a statement has been unreasonably included in the notice of decision you may apply, under Section 43(7) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 to the Secretary of State to determine whether the Agency's action was unreasonable or not, (the address to write to is as given above). If the Secretary of State determines that the Agency acted unreasonably in including such a statement, the Agency's decision will become ineffective while an appeal is pending and you will be entitled to recover compensation from the Agency in respect of any loss you have suffered in consequence of the statement. Any dispute as to your entitlement to compensation or its amount shall be determined by arbitration.
